MARION WALKING TOUR



During this tour I will show you how Marion has played a small role in shaping the history of our Nation. Marion is known for its Voting Rights history and the events which occurred on February 18, 1965 that led up to Bloody Sunday and the March on Washington which resulted in the passage of the Voting Rights Act of 1965.

We will start out by visiting the sacred grounds of Zion United Methodist Church, where you can sit on the pews where the mass meetings were held and Dr. King visited. The Perry County Courthouse where hundreds of Blacks waited for days trying to get registered to vote.

This 90 minute tour will give you a glimpse into the movement and a taste of the Black Belt.

LINCOLN SCHOOL EXPERIENCE



The Phillips Memorial Auditorium is one of three buildings that remain of the Lincoln Normal School. Lincoln School was founded in 1867 by nine freed slaves to educate the newly freed slaves. The school included teacher training (Lincoln Normal University for Teachers). After a fire the teacher training department was relocated to Montgomery where it became ALABAMA STATE UNIVERSITY.

This tour will include the documentary, "Where Once We Stood" and a visit through the Lincoln School Museum and Auditorium.
